



What is EIP?

The Early Intervention Program (EIP) is designed to serve students who are 'at risk' of not reaching or maintaining academic grade level."

"The purpose of the EIP program is to provide additional resources to help students who are performing below grade level to obtain the necessary academic skills in order to reach grade level performance in the shortest time possible."

EIP is NOT Special Education.

It is in addition to regular instruction in the classroom. It does NOT take the place of regular classroom instruction.

EIP is "extra help," like a band-aid. Students have many successful skills, but a few 'holes' here and there that need to be filled. Our role is to make them 'whole.' Everyone's 'holes' or gaps are different sizes and different places.

We often refer to EIP as "double dosing". Entry into EIP is NOT automatic each year.

Unlike Special Education, students are not automatically in the program each year. Students have to re-qualify for the program each year.
